25th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Once I gave my three-year-old niece a certain toy for Christmas. When she opened it, she was happy. Shortly thereafter her five-year old sister opened another present from me: the same toy, along with some play jewelry. The three-year-old cried out: "That's not fair! Why'd she get the jewelry, too?!"

Let's face it: there's something about God's grace in our religion which bugs us. We love to look at others' blessings and cry out: "That's not fair!" Catholicism is not fair in the sense that it is a religion founded on God's grace which is unmerited favor. God pours his mercy, love, and divine life upon us not because we're good but because He is infinitely good.

If you think the "not fair" quality of grace is easy to accept, consider how typically angry we get when we hear the parable of the workers who get paid way more than they deserve. The hyper-generous landowner says to the indignant hard workers, "Are you envious because I am generous?" Well, yes, they are, and so are we! Therefore, we have to reckon with this painful truth in order to move into the divine sphere of gifts, which is the world of Christ and his Church. Then we are able to move beyond a tit-for-tat world and into one where gifts are poured forth on those who don't deserve it — namely, upon us. — Father John Muir ©LPi

HONORING OUR PAST A MOMENT

IN ST. FRANCIS XAVIER PARISH HISTORY

In the early to mid 1960's, the Diocese was changing priests often in our area. From 1961-1966 our parish's spiritual leadership changed 3 times in five years! This month you will learn about the third priest during this time, his name was Rev. Jerome Jaworski. • Father Jaworski was our pastor from 1964-1966 ● All of our previous priests had come from Belgium and Germany in the early years and then beginning in 1917 all were from the St. Louis area. Father Jaworski, however, was born in Pittsburgh, PA. • His stay in our parish was only a year and a half. During this time, two important dedications took place. • With the completion of the Helias Memorial, a dedication ceremony was held on May 31,1965. (The work had begun a year earlier when Fr. Helias' body was exhumed and re-entombed in the back of the church.) • Also dedicated on that same date was the new 4 room addition to the school and hall which had begun the previous year under the guidance of Msgr. Poelker. • These two dedications were performed by Most Rev. Joseph M. Marling, the first bishop of the Jefferson City Diocese. • Fr. Jaworski was transferred to St. George's Parish in Linn in1966. • HIs final assignment was at St. Anthony's Parish in St. Anthony. • He died on March 11, 1979 and is buried in his hometown of Pittsburgh, PA. During this year and a half, Father Ralph Keyes served as the assistant pastor during Fr. Jaworski's pastorate. • Fr. Keyes was the first priest that was assigned to our parish that was born in Ireland. He was ordained specifically for the Diocese of Jefferson City, as were many other seminarians from Ireland during that time. • In 1966, he was transferred to St. Peter's Cathedral, in Jefferson City as an assistant pastor. ● In 1967, he responded to Bishop Marling's call to serve as a missionary to the newly formed mission in Peru. • In the 1960's and 70's there was much political strife and conflict in this poor country. ● Fr. Keyes was dedicated to the needs of the people he served. He was the Coordinator of the Mission Team and served in the Peruvian Missions for 35 years with much bravery and distinction. • When he returned to priestly service within the Jefferson City Diocese in 2002, he was assigned to parishes in Camdenton, Climax Springs and Hermitage. ● Fr. Keyes was pastor at these parishes until his death on July 14, 2012. He is buried in Ireland.
