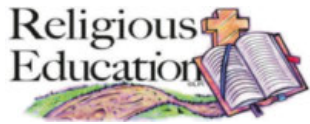

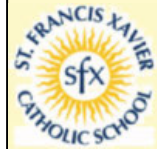

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP: Scheduled for Saturday, April 6th at 8:00 am.

Cemetery mowing season begins soon. In an effort to keep our cemetery grounds neatly mowed and trimmed, items anywhere in the grass or surrounding a monument **after April 6th** will be removed. Decorations must be attached or in the vases of the actual monument. Shepherd hooks and solar lights are not allowed.

The cemetery committee reserves the right to remove any items from the cemetery grounds that become unsightly or interfere with the maintenance and upkeep of the cemetery grounds during mowing season. Flower decorations that are out of season, weathered, torn, faded or unsightly even in the vases will be removed by April 6th. All and any type of memory items (crosses, statues, pictures, rocks, etc.) must be on the base of the monument. Please keep in mind, the wind can blow flowers out of vases and blow saddles off the monument. In this case, since we do not know who they belong to, we must throw them out.

If you do not want anything thrown away from or around the monument, we ask that you remove it **by April 6th**. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Kenny Borgmeyer at 573-659-0791. HONORING THE PAST AND PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER CATHOLIC PARISH

Since its beginning in 1838, when Father Helias first came to the area to minister to the many German Catholic immigrants, our parish has flourished and grown because of the active members of our faith community.

- In those beginning years of the parish, the congregation was very poor. A crude log church was built in 1840 and used until 1845. Although the parish was still young, plans were made in 1844 to erect a new stone church that would serve the growing parish and would be more pleasing to worship God. Father Helias wrote to his family and friends in Europe to send money for the things needed for the new church to be built. Many in the congregation provided labor to build the church but the furnishings were largely bought with money from Fr. Helias' European family and friends.

- Some 40 years later, in 1883, our present church was built with the sweat and determination of the pastor and parishioners. Times were tough, and it took almost 20 years for our church to be fully adorned and decorated. From the parish's beginnings in 1838 to 1900, the parish grew from 20 to 100 families!

- The parish was blessed again in 1920, when funds were raised to build our present school. Also around this time the Rectory was built and completed in 1923. During the depression years, the parish found itself in great debt. With the efforts and organization of Fr. Ebert and the time, talent, hard work, and treasure of the parishioners, the parish slowly worked its way out of debt. In 1938, the parish proudly celebrated its 100th Anniversary.

- In 1952, a door-to-door fundraising campaign took place to raise \$72,000 to restore and redecorate the church. A much-needed convent, now the parish office, was also built in 1958, thanks to money bequeathed to the parish by a parishioner.

- By 1983, the church was again in need of repair. The *Centennial Campaign Appeal* was launched to raise \$300,000 to coincide with the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the building of our church and the 150th Anniversary of our parish. This goal was met in July 1986. During this time the church was completely renovated and redecorated and new electrical and heating systems installed. This campaign also helped to fund many projects and updates in the school. In 1986, the roof was replaced on the church and the convent.

- It has been over 25 years since our last fund-raising effort. *Our Parish, Our Future* was the title of the campaign that began in 1998. During this time, approximately 1.7 million dollars were raised. Much was accomplished because of this campaign. The outside of the church was tuck-pointed and waterproofed. The interior of the church was painted and redecorated, bringing back many of the older stencils and artwork that had been covered over with paint. The historical paintings along with hand-painted stations of the cross were restored. The pews and the kneelers were also refurbished at this time.

- Another part of the *Our Parish, Our Future* campaign was a new addition to the school. This addition included a new cafeteria and 3 new classrooms on the bottom level. On the top level, several classrooms were added along with a library, faculty workroom and restrooms. This beautiful addition has served our

children well in these ever-changing times in education.

- Time and time again, our parish community has seen a need to improve and grow. The generosity of parishioners over the decades has shown a deep commitment to the Catholic faith and the education of our children. We now see this need again. Our new campaign, ***Preserving Our Faith, Forging Our Future***, is an opportunity to continue what our ancestors have accomplished throughout the years. St. Francis Xavier Parish has always been a thriving Catholic community which honors its past and improves itself for generations to come. We are being called at this time to look to the future and recognize some much-needed improvements that will help our parish flourish. May God continue to bless us with His abiding love and may we continue our commitment and our service to His kingdom by participating in this campaign.

Greetings friends. We wanted to give you a brief update on where we are with some of the Energize Our Parish projects that we promised. First, thanks for your overwhelming support! We have raised over \$17,000 to be spent exclusively on EOP projects. And, we've had over 100 parishioners sign up to help with projects. Here's an update on some of those projects:

 - African open house/happy hour at the rectory. Assembling the team and hope to have our first one on Wednesday, **July 10th**. These will be at the rectory from 5-7:30 so folks can stop by for a bit on their way home from work or come up at their leisure.
 - Weekly inspirational emails. **Fr. Paul Clark** has agreed to do a video series on "the parts of the Mass". We're also looking into a "how to go to confession" series. Stay tuned.
 - Youth Ministry. Laurie Herzing, Lisa Scheulen and Stacie Verslues are leading that team in conjunction with St. Stanislaus. Making progress.
 - For those that signed up. We haven't forgotten about anyone, just please be patient as we try to plan all this stuff. Don't worry, you'll be put to work. Thank you.
