18th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for. — Father John Muir ©I Pi

Assumption was one of Fr. Ferdinand Helias' original 7 parishes and was closed in the

1990's. It is now under the care of Annunciation Parish in California and only offers Mass twice a year. It will be the second parish we visit on our pilgrimage of visiting Father Helias's churches.

Honoring the "Apostle of Central MO"

August 11 marks the 150th anniversary of the death of Father Ferdinand Helias, a remarkable man, with great passion and zeal for helping bring the Word of God to us here in central MO. If you recall, in an earlier article I told of how Fr. Helias died as he was going out to ring the evening Angeles bell. When his neighbors didn't hear the bell ringing they went to check on him and found him dead in the churchyard of an apparent stroke. The date was August 11, 1874, Fr. Helias was 78 years old. He had given 36 years of his life to the people of this area.

Highlights of the life of Father Helias

- Father Helias was born on Aug. 4, 1796 in Ghent, Belgium.
- He was ordained a Jesuit priest on June 5, 1825 at the age of 29.
- His dream to become a Catholic missionary in America came true for him in 1833 when his Jesuit superiors in Europe sent him to America. He spent time in Maryland, Pennsylvania & was finally sent to Missouri where he taught at the Jesuit University & ministered to the German Catholics in St. Louis.
- In 1838 he was sent by Bishop Rosati of St Louis to the wilds of central MO to establish a Catholic Mission with Westphalia as its headquarters.
- Father Helias visited 11 counties in central MO, starting over 20 Catholic Missions.
- From 1838-1845, he established 7 Catholic parishes in central MO. Parishes in Westphalia, Taos, Rich Fountain, Jefferson City-St. Peters, Cedron, Loose Creek and St. Thomas were all founded by Fr. Helias.
- In 1842, Father Helias made St. Francis Xavier his home parish. He continued to travel and administer to other parishes until the mid 1840's when more priests became available.
- Father Helias spent the rest of his years as the pastor of St. Francis as well as continuing to visit other missions that he had founded.
- His death in 1874, was mourned by many people throughout the central MO area. He was beloved by both Catholics and non-Catholics alike and his funeral was largely attended.
- Fr. Helias was buried in the old Taos cemetery until 1964 when a more fitting memorial was made for him. Under the direction of Dulle Funeral Home, his body was exhumed and then re-entombed in the vestibule of SFX church on Memorial Day in 1964.
- Many other parishes along with the Helias
 Council of the Knights of Columbus helped to defray the cost of this beautiful memorial.

• In 1974, 100 years after Fr. Helias' death, a centennial celebration took place in our parish to honor this great priest for his spiritual commitment, bravery and determination to bring the Catholic faith to central MO. A memorial in the side yard of the SFX church was erected and then dedicated at this celebration on the spot where most believed he died as he went to ring the Angelus bell on the evening of Aug. 11, 1874.

SFX parish is proud to share Fr. Helias' life and legacy with others in the diocese. We can still feel his presence today as he watches over us and reminds us of the importance of being part of a strong Catholic community. A special Mass in honor of Fr. Helias will be held on Sun. 8/11 at the 10:00 Mass on the 150 anniversary of his death.


